# CITY COUNCIL SPECIAL MEETING ON JANUARY 30, 2021 TO PRIORITIZE SPECIAL PROJECTS FOR THE REMAINDER OF FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2020-21

The City Council will hold a special Council meeting on Saturday January 30, 2021 to conduct teambuilding and to provide direction to staff on which special projects to prioritize for the remainder of the current fiscal year, 2020-21. The Council will review the special projects ("strategies") contained in the 2020-2025 Strategic Plan as well as other special projects the Council has identified as future agenda items and determine priority among them. The meeting will begin at 10 am and is planned to conclude by 2 pm. Emergency Services Consulting International (ESCI) will be presenting the Regional Fire Service Delivery Study, which they completed in 2020, to the City Council at the regularly scheduled Council meeting on Tuesday, February 16, 2021.

#### MTC BLUE RIBBON TRANSIT RECOVERY TASK FORCE

The Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) is the transportation planning and coordinating agency for the nine-county San Francisco Bay Area region.

The ridership and revenues of transit agencies in the Bay Area, such as BART, WestCAT, and AC Transit, have declined significantly due to the COVID-19 pandemic and stay-at-home orders. This has prompted MTC to create a Blue Ribbon Transit Recovery Task Force to guide Bay Area transit agencies as they respond to and recover from the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. The Task Force will also create a Bay Area Public Transit Transformation Action Plan that will describe the actions needed to re-shape the region's transit system into a more connected, more efficient, and more user-focused mobility network across the entire Bay Area.

# CITY OF PINOLE COVID-19 SMALL BUSINESS ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The City of Pinole has created a COVID-19 Small Business Assistance Program through which the City will provide grants to small businesses to help offset the revenue they have lost due to the pandemic. The City has set aside funding to provide 100 grants of \$1,000 each to small businesses in sectors that have been most impacted by COVID-19. The City will announce the program and open the application period next week. Look for more information next week on the City's website, City Hall Facebook page, and in the mailboxes of small businesses.

#### FOOD DISTRIBUTION

The Food Bank of Contra Costa and Solano County will be providing free boxes of nonperishable food and bags of fresh produce every second Monday of the month. The next drive-thru distribution is on Monday, February 8th from 9 AM to 11 AM (or as supplies last) at the Pinole Senior Center parking lot, 2500 Charles Ave. You do NOT need to be a member of the Pinole Senior Center or a senior to receive food. Quantities are limited. First come first serve. One box and/or bag per household. This will be a contact-less event, please follow the directions from staff and volunteers when you arrive. Food items will be placed in the trunk by staff/volunteers. Parking or exiting your vehicle will not be allowed. All participants must follow social distancing guidelines and wear a face covering. #### **FIRE INCIDENT**

At approximately 5:40 a.m. on Thursday, January 21, Pinole Fire Department responded with resources from Pinole Police Department, Contra Costa County Fire, Rodeo-Hercules Fire, El Cerrito Fire, Richmond Fire, and Crockett-Carquinez Fire, to a two-alarm structure fire on the 1900 block of Galbreath Road. Police personnel safely evacuated the occupants as fire crews performed an aggressive fire attack to contain the fire to the building of origin and prevent spread to adjacent homes. There were no reported injuries, and one dog was rescued by crews on scene.

# **Planning Commission (2 positions):**


The Pinole Planning Commission is a seven-member panel who act on development requests and make policy recommendations to the City Council. The Commission usually meets on the 4<sup>th</sup> Monday of every month at 7:00 pm in the City Council Chamber, although additional meetings may be called as required. Commissioners serve four-year terms.

# **Community Services Commission (2 positions):**

The Community Services Commission is comprised of seven members who must be Pinole residents. The Commission serves in an advisory capacity to the City Council in matters pertaining to public recreation, parks, arts and cultural activities, historical activities, public access television activities, senior and youth activities, and community services. The Commission reviews and recommends policies and procedures governing recreation, park, and community services for approval by the City Council; maintains relationships with schools, community, and civic organizations; advocates for recreation and community services for the community; and collaborates with civic clubs, nonprofit organizations, and citizen groups to provide funds, property and or volunteerism for the development and operation of parks and recreation facilities. The Community Services Commission meets monthly on the 4th Wednesday at 5pm. Commissioners service two-year terms.
