Food items will be placed in the trunk by staff/volunteers. Parking or exiting your vehicle will not be allowed. All participants must follow social distancing guidelines and wear a face covering. CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) UPDATE

The average daily number of new cases in Contra Costa has fallen enough that California moved the county from the purple tier to the red tier, effective Sunday, March 14.

City Hall remains open on an appointment-only basis for the time being. Certain City facilities will remain closed for the time being, including the Senior Center and Youth Center. The City will reopen these facilities as soon as possible.

PRESENTATION ON RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE FIRE DEPARMENT

In response to the ESCI Pinole Regional Fire Service Delivery Study, the presentation of the Fire Chief and City Staff recommendations for the Fire Department, which was scheduled to be discussed at the March 16, 2021 City Council meeting, was rescheduled for April 6, 2021. The item was rescheduled due to the lateness of the meeting, and to provide the public and the Council with ample time to discuss the matter. WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH

On March 16th, the City Council approved a Proclamation recognizing the month of March as "Women's History Month." HISTORIC PRESVERATION ORDINANCE

At the March 16, 2021 City Council meeting, the Council discussed the addition of Chapter 17.28 Historic Preservation Overlay District to the Zoning Ordinance. The purpose of this Ordinance is to protect and enhance the Downtown Area's historic and cultural heritage. There was a good discussion regarding the district, properties in the district, and the implementation of the ordinance. After a lengthy discussion the City Council decided to continue this item to a future Council meeting.

ASPHALT PATCH PAVING TRUCK

The Public Works Department received the new Asphalt Patch Paving truck on March 4. The Public Works Staff will utilize the new truck to make repairs to the streets as part of pavement repair program. The truck is a self-contained that has heater on the truck to keep the asphalt hot while make the street repairs. The truck also carries its own compactor so that Public Works Staff can minimize the amount of equipment needed on the road to make repairs. The Public Works Department is very excited about the new piece of equipment and is ready to utilize the new addition to improve the condition of the streets in the City.

Community Services Commission (2 positions): Applications due to City Clerk by March 31, 2021

The Community Services Commission is comprised of seven members who must be Pinole residents. The Commission serves in an advisory capacity to the City Council in matters pertaining to public recreation, parks, arts and cultural activities, historical activities, public access television activities, senior and youth activities, and community services. The Commission reviews and recommends policies and procedures governing recreation, park, and community services for approval by the City Council; maintains relationships with schools, community, and civic organizations; advocates for recreation and community services for the community; and collaborates with civic clubs, nonprofit organizations, and citizen groups to provide funds, property and or volunteerism for the development and operation of parks and recreation facilities. The Community Services Commission meets monthly on the 4th Wednesday at 5pm. Commissioners service two-year terms.

Traffic and Pedestrian Safety Committee (2 positions) Applications due to City Clerk by March 31, 2021

The Pinole Traffic and Pedestrian Safety Committee is a five-member panel who recommend or review action on traffic safety, traffic control and planning, speed limits, parking, and other traffic related matters. The committee makes recommendations to the City Council, committee members service two-year terms.

Women's History Month March 1-31, 2021
