## CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) UPDATE

### California's Grand Reopening on June 15

Starting June 15, the state will move Beyond the Blueprint for a Safer Economy and eliminate the color-coded tier system for counties. This means there will be far fewer restrictions on business and social activity, although things still won't be exactly like they were before the pandemic.

While there won't be capacity limits on businesses, masking will still be required for everyone in several settings, including City of Pinole workplace facilities. Some businesses may choose to maintain masking or distancing requirements for their patrons in their facilities, which is their right.

Here's a quick breakdown of the new rules for outdoor and indoor settings:

- Capacity limitations:** No restrictions
- Physical distancing:** No restrictions for attendees, customers and guests. Workers on the job must maintain physical distancing and schools should keep student desks at least 3 feet apart.
- Masking:** Fully vaccinated people do not need to wear masks in most settings. Unvaccinated people must still wear masks in indoor public settings and businesses. Everyone must still wear masks in the workplace, on public transit, medical facilities, K-12 schools and correctional facilities and shelters.
- Employers/workplaces:** Most are subject to the Cal/OSHA COVID-19 Prevention Emergency Temporary Standards (ETS). Cal/OSHA will be reviewing its workplace guidance on masking and distancing on June 17.
- Travelers:** follow CDC recommendations and CDPH Travel Advisory
- Vaccine verification/negative COVID-19 test:** required for indoor mega events (5000+ attendees) and recommended for outdoor mega events (10,000+ attendees).

### **SUMMER WILDFIRE AND HEAT PREPAREDNESS ACTIVITIES**

The Fire Department has retained the services of three contractors – for fire breaks/trails, weed abatement, and tree service, respectively – to collaborate with the Public Works Department in support of the City's most robust annual wildfire mitigation project to date. Much of Pinole's fire danger exists in its approximately 400 acres of designated open space. By zoning requirement, open space is reserved as undeveloped land vacant of structures and improvements, maintained in its natural condition, and not to be altered to any major extent by human activities. The Fire and Public Works Departments are working diligently to create a defensible perimeter around the City's designated open space while adhering to zoning requirements. Additionally, notices have been sent out to property owners reminding them of their responsibility to maintain defensible space around residential and commercial properties. City Code Enforcement is hard at work to ensure compliance with this effort.

### **COOLING CENTER**

Per City guidelines, the Senior Center (2500 Charles Avenue) will be opened as a cooling center if the National Weather Service (NWS) forecasts that Pinole will experience two consecutive days with high temperatures of 95 degrees or more and necessary staff is available. When initiated, the cooling center will normally be open from 12 pm to 5 pm. Quantities are limited. First come first serve. One box and/or bag per household. This will be a contact-less event, please follow the directions from staff and volunteers when you arrive. Food items will be placed in the trunk by staff/volunteers. Parking or exiting your vehicle will not be allowed. All participants must follow social distancing guidelines and wear a face covering. ## Accepted Items



- Electronic waste with circuit boards (including microwaves, computers, TVs, and cell phones)
- Auto products (antifreeze, gasoline, batteries, used motor oil and filters)
- Propane gas cylinders, hazardous aerosols/cleaners/sprays and poisons
- Paints, solvents, thinners, and adhesives
- Household batteries, fluorescent lights, mercury thermometers and switches
- Garden products (pesticides and fertilizers)
- Pool and photo chemicals
- Mattresses and box springs (maximum of 3 items; no excessively wet or damaged mattress; no furniture)
- State regulations limit the transportation of HHW to 15 gallons or 125 pounds per vehicle per visit. Individual containers are limited to a 5 gallon capacity

## Prohibited Items

- No garbage
- No furniture
- No business waste, no trailers
- No explosives, ammunition, medical waste, pharmaceuticals, sharps or radioactive waste
- No appliances, including stoves, refrigerators, washers/dryers, vacuums, toasters, coffee makers
- No TVs in consoles or TVs over 36" (flatscreens are accepted)
- No hazardous construction debris (asbestos, pressure treated wood waste, contaminated soil, etc)
- No electric vehicle batteries

Residents of El Sobrante, Hercules, Richmond, Pinole, San Pablo, El Cerrito, and Unincorporated West Contra Costa County (*Kensington residents are not eligible*)

## Health Guidelines



- Per Contra Cost County Health orders: Face coverings and masks are required for all vehicle passengers at all times. All participants must remain in the vehicle at all times. All materials must be placed in the trunk or in the rear most portion of the vehicle. Failure to follow these guidelines will result in refusal of service.

# Say Bye Bye to your Old Mattress & Box Spring

Republic Services has teamed up with the Mattress Recycling Council's Bye Bye Mattress Program to allow eligible residents to drop-off old unwanted mattresses, box springs, or futons at no additional charge. **Wednesday through Saturday from 9AM-4PM households in the following cities/communities are eligible to bring 3 items per month to be recycled: cities of Richmond, Hercules, Pinole, San Pablo, El Cerrito and these surrounding unincorporated communities: Alhambra Valley-west side, Bayview, East Richmond Heights, El Sobrante, Montalvin, North Richmond, Rollingwood and Tara Hills.** Drop offs will not be available if the Wednesday is on a holiday (New Year's Day, July 4<sup>th</sup>, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day).

Only whole mattresses and box springs accepted. Items that are NOT accepted:

- Parts of or partial mattresses or box springs
- Excessively wet, damaged, or soiled mattresses or mattresses with bed bugs
- Fold out sofa beds, or crib mattresses
- Waterbeds, car beds, air mattresses, sleeping bags, pillows, mattress toppers or other furniture

**Mattresses and box springs can be dropped off by eligible residents Wednesdays - Saturdays, 9AM-4PM at 101 Pittsburg Avenue, Richmond. Please bring proper identification or utility bill with address of household generating the items.**

Drop-off is not available to businesses, but items can be taken to the Golden Bear Transfer Station (1 Parr Blvd. Richmond) for a fee. For more information about mattress and box spring recycling, **contact Republic Services recycling center at 888.412.9277**
