CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) UPDATE

COVID-19 VACCINES APPROVED FOR KIDS UNDER AGE 5

Federal and state health officials have authorized pediatric COVID-19 vaccines for children ages 6 months to 4 years. Previously, COVID-19 vaccine had only been available for kids ages 5+. ITEMS OF INTEREST

TRAFFIC SIGNALS AT APPIAN AND CANYON/TARA HILLS

On Thursday, September 15, 2022, a telecommunications company installing fiber optic lines within the public right of way at the Appian and Canyon/Tara Hills intersection damaged the traffic signal wiring. During their directional boring across Appian Way towards Tara Hills Drive, the boring equipment cut through the traffic signal conduit and the traffic signal cable. This resulted in all traffic lights at the intersection reverting to a flashing red status, essentially making this intersection an all-way stop intersection. The boring work is being done under an encroachment permit by a private utility company (it is not a City project). The repairs will take at least two weeks to complete. The telecommunication company will bear all of the costs of repair and temporary traffic control. The City is working to install mobile temporary traffic signals to manage the intersection. Until the temporary traffic signals are placed, during commute hours, City Public Works staff will provide flagging. Please be patient and avoid the intersection if possible or plan to have additional time in hand to navigate this intersection for a while.

SPECIAL CITY COUNCIL MEETING TO CONSIDER APPROVAL OF CONTRACT FOR FIRE SERVICE WITH CON FIRE POSTPONED

To allow additional time for the City and the Contra Costa County Fire Protection District (CCCFPD, "Con Fire") to finalize contract language, the City of Pinole has postponed the special meeting of the City Council that had been set for September 27, 2022 at which the contract was to be considered for approval. The City will announce a new meeting date as soon as a final contract is ready for the City Council's consideration.

CITY WELCOMES NEW SUSTAINABILITY FELLOW

On September 8 the City welcomed Kapil Amin to the Community Development Department team to serve as a Sustainability Fellow over the next 10 months. Kapil's position with the City is through SEI's Climate Corps, a fellowship program that provides opportunity for emerging sustainability leaders to work for government agencies, as well as non-profits, for profits and schools. Kapil will be helping the City's efforts to develop a Climate Action and Adaptation Plan (CAAP), which will provide equity, climate mitigation and climate resiliency for current and future generations. He will also be working on other important environmental

issues for the City, including assisting to implement a variety of programs that will make Pinole a more sustainable city. Kapil received his undergraduate degree in Biology from the University of California, Riverside and is currently pursuing his Master's in Sustainability at Harvard Extension. He ultimately hopes to be a Sustainability Manager in a local government setting due to his passion for public service and environmental protection. In his free time, Kapil enjoys hiking, painting, creative writing, and cooking.

PINOLE RECEIVES GRANT TO ESTABLISH ONLINE, AUTOMATED SOLAR PERMITTING

The City of Pinole has been awarded up to a \$40,000 grant from the California Energy Commission to establish an online, automated permitting platform that verifies code compliance and issues permits in real time for a solar energy system. This grant funding will help the City continue to persue and fully implement a small pilot program initiated in 2022 with SolarAPP+. SolarAPP+ is a web-based portal, developed by the National Renewable Energy Laboratory, that automates project plan review and produces code-compliant approvals to support building departments in quickly issuing permits for residential solar energy system installations. The Community Development Department is expected to introduce SolarAPP+ to all customers soon after the city has fully updated its outdated permit tracking system (anticipated in early 2023).

COASTAL CLEANUP DAY 2022

Thank you to everyone who helped make a difference in the Pinole watershed by participating in Coastal Cleanup Day on September 17, 2022. We had over 275 volunteers who covered 5 miles and collected approximately 900 lbs. of trash and 200 lbs. of recyclables.

Missed your chance to participate? Clean up your neighborhood, parks, and local area anytime during the month of September. Trash from inland areas flows downstream to the coast, so cleaning up neighborhood trash prevents marine debris. Gather cleanup supplies from home, download the CleanSwell App (to count your trash, and have your have trash counted), and clean on your own time. All clean up that takes place during September will count towards our statewide goals!

WEED ABATEMENT

Fire season has arrived and with the continued drought, this season of **overgrown vegetation is extremely hazardous**. In March, the city mailed out its annual fire season letter to the community. The letter informed property owners that they are required to do their part to make our community safe by complying with the following:

- All properties: all weeds are required to be cut within three inches off the ground.
- Large properties (5 acres and above): a minimum of 30 feet of defensible space is required around the perimeter of the property and fire breaks of at least 20 feet wide are required every five acres throughout the property.

Defensible space means removing dry or dead vegetation at least 30 to 100 feet and 100 feet on a slope from all structures. Examples of common defensible space measures include pruning tree branches away from roofs and chimneys, clearing debris from roofs, and using fire-resistant plants in landscaping, in addition to other strategies.

The deadline for compliance with weed abatement requirements was May 31st. If a property owner fails to correct the violation, the City may issue citations with fines ranging from \$100 to \$500 a day. If the property owner does not comply, the city may obtain an abatement warrant to abate the violation. All fines and costs associated with the abatement action are than placed as a special assessment against the property.
