TRASH ACCUMULATION

As we head into the gift-giving season, empty packages, discarded wrapping and other waste

may begin to pile up. In fact, the average American throws away 25% more trash during Thanksgiving to New Years. The City of Pinole is reminding residents this holiday season that accumulation of trash in front yards not only looks unsightly and is considered a property nuisance, but it may also lead to actual damage to your property. Trash accumulation can lead to rodent infestation and a breeding ground for other pests, both large and small. Cockroaches live in warm, dark, enclosed areas, and can spread diseases that cause food poisoning and dysentery. Flies pick up and spread germs as they move from one pile of trash to the next, or on other surfaces. When they land, flies regurgitate, quickly spreading these harmful germs. Rodents contaminate products through their urine, hair, feces, and saliva. They chew through just about anything and can cause structural damage as they gnaw on electrical wires, gas lines, support beams and even asphalt. City of Pinole Code Enforcement is happy to supply any information requested about trash accumulation and how to address the issue. Feel free to give Code Enforcement

ATTENTION BUSINESS OWNERS!

Pinole business licenses for 2022 will expire on December 31, 2022. Business license taxes for 2023 are due on December 31, 2022 and become delinquent on February 1, 2023, at which time unpaid taxes are subject to a 50% penalty. There is a change to the business license tax rate for calendar year 2023. The tax for the basic business license is \$160.00 per year (not including the \$4.00 AB 1379 state mandated fee).

Business license renewal forms were mailed out November 23, 2022. Renewal forms are mailed to you as a courtesy; we make every effort to make sure that a renewal form is mailed to each active business. If you do not receive a renewal form, it is the business owner's responsibility to pay the business license tax by January 31, 2023. Please remit your payment to:
